
# BUSH CARE – COOKS CREEK CONSERVATION RAIN GARDEN PROJECT 2011

- The Cooks river catchment covers an area of 100km including Strathfield municipality area.
- The Sathya Sai Center Strathfield in conjunction with Strathfield Municipal Council started the Bush care program by taking part in tree planting, weeding and regeneration of vegetation.
- In 2010 the region East of the SSIO took over the program and it became a regular service activity.
- Some major contribution
  - Tree plantation in Alan street Reserve
  - Bush regeneration in Mason Park (bird Sanctuary)
  - Annual national tree planting in July organized by Plant arc and Strathfield Council
- Currently the NSW region East bush care activity is coordinate under enviro care program.




