

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THE RELIGION OF LOVE

"There Is only one Religion, the Religion of Love There Is only one Caste, the Caste of Humanity. There Is only one Language, the Language of the Heart There Is only one God, and He is Omnipresent."

Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba

The world today has many conflicts because people do not understand this profound message, especially the truth that there is only one God who is worshiped in many names and forms. The underlying principle of all religions and faiths is love, which transcends all barriers of ethnicity, nationality, and creed. But sadly, this has been forgotten.

Over the centuries, religions and faith traditions have been caught up in various dogmas, doctrines, and rituals. They were lost in the details, forgetting the big picture of the underlying unity of all faiths. This even led to many wars being fought, and, in the name of religion, bigotry, fanaticism, sectarianism, and hypocrisy are practiced. Thus, the very purpose of religion, which is the realization of Truth, is pushed into oblivion, and we are caught up in unnecessary distractions that lead us astray.

But all these pitfalls should not get us disheartened. Why fear when Sai is here as an eternal companion to rescue us? Those are Swami's own words in a letter to Smt. Subbamma which has been included in this issue. In fact, from time to time, great incarnations like Sri Rama, Sri Krishna, Lord Jesus, the Buddha, Sri Ramakrishna, Shirdi Sai, and, of course, our own Swami have come to teach the path of love, which leads us out of ignorance and misery. Their teachings and presence also give us hope and inspire us in our spiritual journey, lifting our spirits and motivating us to continue on the path of love.

Purpose Behind the Divine Descent

Every year, the 20th of October is celebrated as 'Avatar Declaration Day' by the devotees and followers of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba around the world. This is the day when, in His infinite kindness and compassion, Swami declared that He is Sai Baba come again after the Shirdi Avatar. He also proclaimed His divine mission and reassured the devotees of His protection.

Avatarhood represents the descent of God for the ascent of man. Supreme God head descends as an avatar in a beautiful human form with a sweet name to convey the eternal message of divine love to humanity. In the historic letter He wrote on 25th May 1947, Swami says that He has come to bestow bliss on all beings and transform those who stray away from the right path, bringing them back again to goodness and saving them. On other occasions, Swami has declared that He has come for Vedasamrakshana (to protect, preserve, and propagate the Vedas), Vidwatposhana (nurturing the wise and spiritual people), and to teach man the universality and oneness of all religions. Swami conveys all these messages by example through His own life.

Oneness According to Bharatiya Scriptures


Our focus on diversity rather than unity is the cause for forgetting the truth that there is only one religion—that of Love. The Rig Veda, the foremost and the most ancient among the Vedas, declares *Ekam Sath Viprah Bahuda Vadanti* (The Truth is One, though the Wise call it by different names). This is akin to water being called by various names, including H₂O, aqua, *tanni*, *neeru*, *pani*, etc.

The Vedas also talk about the aphorism Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, the entire world being part of the same family. That is why the universal prayer taught from time immemorial is Samastha Lokah Sukhino Bhavantu. Swami emphasized that this prayer must be sung in all Sathya Sai Centers and meetings. It prays for the welfare of not just all humanity but also for animals, birds, plants,

planets, stars, and galaxies. That is the broad vision—to see only oneness in all existence without any division whatsoever.

The Purusha Suktam, an important hymn in the Vedas, describes the entire universe as the manifestation of divinity. But God is much more than just the universe. Precisely, only one-fourth of God manifests as the universe, while three-fourth lies beyond.

One particular verse in the Bhagavad Gita (4.11) proclaims further the oneness of all 'Gods' and 'Paths.'

ye yatha mam prapadyante thams tathaiva bhajamyaham mama vartmanuvartante manushyah partha sarvashah

(In whatever way people surrender unto Me, I reciprocate accordingly. Everyone follows My path, knowingly or unknowingly, O son of Pritha.)

This gives the wonderful message not to condemn different traditions or paths and to give up the 'holier than thou' attitude. Lord Krishna also states in another verse (Bhagavad Gita 6.30)

yo mam pashyati sarvatra sarvam cha mayi pashyati tasyaham na pranashyami sa cha me na pranashyati

(For those who see Me everywhere and see all things in Me, I am never lost, nor are they ever lost to Me.)

This shows that seeing the underlying oneness is the greatest spiritual practice. In fact, in yet another verse (Bhagavad Gita 18.20), Lord Krishna says,

sarva-bhuteshu yenaikam bhavam avyayam ikshate avibhaktam vibhakteshu taj-jnanam viddhi sattvikam

(Understand that knowledge is the goodness by which a person sees one undivided imperishable reality within all diverse living beings.)

The wise one sees unity in diversity, while the ignoramus sees diversity in oneness.

Other Indian scriptures, too, are replete with statements that emphasize this oneness. One such proclamation says:

Akasat patitam toyam yatha gacchati sagaram Sarvadeva namaskaram kesavam pratigacchati Sarvadeva tirasskaram kesavam pratigacchati

(As all the raindrops falling from the sky ultimately reach the ocean, the worship of any god ultimately reaches the one Supreme Being. Similarly, censuring of any aspect of the divine also ultimately reaches the Supreme Being.)

So, whenever we adore anyone or anything, we are adoring God. If we genuinely love Swami, we must respect and love all names, forms, and beings, for all are Him. This is verily the profound message Swami gives in His discourse on May 17, 1968, "This is a human form in which every divine entity, every divine principle, that is to say, all the names and forms ascribed by man to God, are manifest."

That is why whenever devotees have yearned for Him sincerely and called for His help anywhere in the world, at any time, He has responded readily. The fact that He is omnipresent, omnipotent, and omniscient becomes clear from the experiences of Mr. Rajesh Thapa, Dr. Suresh Govind, and Ms. Anvitha, published in this issue. Swami has also given *darshan* as Ganesha, Shiva, Rama, Krishna, Jesus, etc., to many devo-

tees as their ishtadevata (chosen deity). In fact, a few devotees have experienced that He is not just Sarva Devata Swaroopa (embodiment of all forms of godhead) but Sarva Devatatheeta Swaroopa (embodiment of that which is beyond all godheads). This further confirms that there is only one God who is omnipresent, omnipotent, and omniscient.

Oneness According to Other Scriptures

The Jewish scripture, Torah, contains the Shema, the central prayer in Judaism, which is also considered the primary confession in the Jewish faith: "Shema Yisrael, Adonai Eloheinu, Adonai Echad!" which means, "Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God, the Lord is one!" Islam also proclaims, "La ilaha illa Allah," which means, "There is one God-Allah." While these are statements of Truth. the problem arises when followers of different faiths make their own interpretation of the scriptures based on their personal dogmas and doctrines.

That is why Jesus came to teach the path of love when the temples of God degenerated into houses of business. He emphasized that mere mechanical repetition of the scriptures wasn't sufficient. One must focus on their essence, which is love. Hence, He declared, "The greatest commandment is to love

thy God with all thy heart, soul, mind, and strength." Equally important is the second commandment to love thy neighbor as thyself. Vedanta clearly answers why one should do this by declaring that the other person is none other than oneself!

Lord Buddha came when people were caught up in rituals, forgetting the spirit behind them. The true spirit behind the ritual is what makes it spiritual. Love for all and sacrifice of evil qualities are essential in all rituals. This is the true significance of 'animal sacrifice'-the sacrifice of one's 'animal qualities.' That is why Buddha preached the path of Ahimsa or nonviolence in His infinite compassion and advised all to stop animal sacrifices.

Oneness According to Modern Masters

In recent times, Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, a great saint and incarnation, showed man how to practice spirituality and realize God. He taught that anyone could see God if one had intense hunger and love for God. He emphatically told his young disciple, Narendranath, that he saw God clearer than anyone else and even spoke to God! Born in the 19th century, he demonstrated that one could see and experience God by practicing any religion. He practiced Christianity, entirely focusing on Christ. Then, he




practiced Islam with a one-pointed focus on Allah. He also worshiped various Indian gods and goddesses. In each case, he experienced the same ultimate bliss and attained the vision of God. He thus demonstrated that all forms of God are the same and emphasized the harmony of all religions.

Swami Vivekananda, who witnessed his Master undertaking such intense spiritual practices, was naturally influenced by Him. It is, therefore, not surprising that he began his historic speech on September 11, 1893, at the Parliament of Religions in Chicago with "Sisters and Brothers of America..." In this landmark address, he emphasized universal tolerance because all paths lead to the same goal, just as all rivers merge into the ocean. He concluded by saying, "I fervently hope that the bell that tolled this morning in honor of this convention may be the death knell of all fanaticism, of all persecutions with the sword or with the pen, and of all uncharitable feelings between persons wending their way to the same goal." Swami Vivekananda had followers from all faiths because people witnessed his universal vision and large-heartedness.

Next came Sai Baba of Shirdi. At a time when there was conflict between the Hindus and Muslims, He advocated the harmony of religions. Without identifying Himself as either Muslim or Hindu, Baba chanted the names of both Allah and Rama with equal fervor. He celebrated both Ramzan and Rama Navami, the holy festivals of Muslims and Hindus, to foster amity and love among the Hindus and Muslims.

Simplicity and Clarity of Swami's Message

Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, the Avatar of the Kali Age, put all these teachings into a simple, pithy statement, "There is only one religion, the religion of Love." He emphasizes that it is not enough just to have tolerance among religions; one has to bring



about harmony between religions, learning from the best of each religion. In addition to supporting Hindu temples, He inaugurated a mosque for the Muslims of Puttaparthi in the early days. He always encourages the celebration of all religious festivals, Hindu festivals like Rama Navami and Dasera, and holy events of other world religions, including Yom Kippur, Buddha Poornima, Ramzan, and Nowruz (Parsi New Year). All festivals are celebrated with the same enthusiasm by the devotees of Sai because all religions teach the same principle of love. During Sai meetings and conferences, the Sarvadharma prayer is sung as part of the program, which adores all names of God, including Narayana, Buddha, Jesus, Allah, Vinayaka, Skanda, Sun, Fire, Ahura Mazda, Jehovah, Rudra, Vishnu, Divine Mother, and also includes the formless aspect of God, namely Brahman and Satchitananda (existence, knowledge, and bliss).

Swami emphasizes the need to see unity among diversity, which will help us live in peace and joy. To see the underlying unity in the apparent diversity, He says,

Nations are many, but Earth is one; Beings are many, but Breath is one; Pots are many, but Clay is one; Flowers are many, but Worship is one; Stars are many, but Sky is one; Oceans are many, but Water is one; Religions are many, but God is one; Jewels are many, but Gold is one.

Sri Sathya Sai International Organization (SSSIO)-Swami's **Torchbearer**

Swami also encourages interfaith dialogues and conferences, which were conducted under His quidance in Prasanthi Nilavam and continue to be held all over the world today. There have been many successful and impactful multi-faith gatherings in North America, South America, Europe, Asia, and Australia.

The SSSIO participated in the Parliament of Religions in 2018 in Toronto, Canada. The organization members gave talks, participated in a panel discussion, performed a drama, and displayed an exhibition where Swami's message that all masters proclaim the same Truth was reinforced. At this event. the SSSIO embraced all views of all faiths as long as they were based on love. However, other faith proponents, though tolerant of all religions and faiths, primarily emphasized their own path and practices! This was a striking difference between Swami's messengers and the others. In practice, the SSSIO embodied Swami's proclamation that all paths lead to the same goal.

During the various interfaith meetings conducted by the SSSIO around the world, SSSIO emphasizes multi-faith prayers and







invites various faith leaders to discuss the best practices of each faith to celebrate the common thread of love.

When Baba returned from East Africa after visiting Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, the devotees celebrated this 'overseas visit.'

Swami said during His discourse, "Your material eyes see countries as different; in reality, all countries are limbs of one organism; all bodies are activated by the same Principle. For God, the universe is the mansion. Each nation is a room, a hall, in that mansion. So, when I move from one room to



another and come back, why do you indulge in all this commotion and celebration? I do not feel that I had been to another mansion: it was all so familiar to Me. You should not also emphasize the apparent distinction; for the Divine, all are the same."

Practical Tips for The Aspirant

To see this underlying unity in diversity, Swami gives a few tips, the foremost of which is the practice of unconditional, selfless, and pure love. Adveshta Sarva Bhootanam, says Sri Krishna and Sai Krishna, exhorting us to hate no being, 'Hatred' cannot be a part of the vocabulary of the lover of God. We must nurture love as embodied by the various Masters over the ages. Following them, we, too, become harbingers of peace and harmony. This love cannot be intellectual and esoteric. It should be practiced so that people experience it. Such love in action is service. All the Masters have emphasized service. Lord Jesus said, "When you serve the least of your brethren, you serve Me." Service of fellow beings is one of the mandates of Islam. The Buddha emphasized treating all beings with love and compassion. Swami simply says, "Manava Seva is

> Madhava Seva," meaning that service to man is service to God. He further simplifies it by saying, "Help Ever, Hurt Never."

> We help (and hurt) through our thoughts, words, and deeds. So, we should be careful on all three fronts. One can provide food, water, shelter, education, medi-

cal aid, etc., to people in need. But even speaking kind words and spreading loving thoughts are also acts of service. Another common teaching across all faiths is the golden rule of 'do unto others as you would have others do unto you.' If everyone practices this golden rule, all will be happy and peaceful.

Seeing only oneness-Atma, Brahman, God, Consciousness-is possible only through love and service. This love and service will also sound the death knell to bigotry, fanaticism, sectarianism, and hypocrisy while ushering in the golden age of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, where the whole world lives as one family.

Let us pray to our Lord, Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, who has laid down the royal path of love, to guide us in being devout followers of this religion of love.




Love God Wholeheartedly

Part 3

This is the final part of the discourse delivered on November 24, 1998. Bhagawan continues to answer questions raised by the delegates and officers of the overseas Sathya Sai Centers. He exhorts one and all to work in unity and love.



about the washerman? Some other person sits to do *japa* (repetition of God's name) and meditation. He then sees the smoke from the kitchen and calls his wife to check if the food is getting burnt. How does this sort of sadhana (spiritual practice) become devotion to God? You are doing all these practices with a wavering mind. Do it with a steady mind, and the results will surely follow.

You may undertake any type of spiritual practice but love with all your heart. With love, all diseases get cured, and all suffering can be overcome. All worries will be gone. First, you should develop love. How to increase the love? If you think God is the embodiment of love, love will increase. But how can we develop love if we think of God with some other feeling? Love is the perfect medicine for this. What happens if a plant is put in a small metal container without soil and watered? It will rot. The tree should be planted in the ground and watered. Similarly, it is not possible to place God's form and name anywhere. Plant the name and form of God in the soil called the heart and water it with love. It will surely grow. So, there is no need to do any special sadhana or spiritual practice.

The sixth question is very strange: We keep the pictures of Rama, Krishna, Allah, Eshwara or Shiva, and Jesus in our puja (prayer) room. We also place Swami's picture between them. They are asking, is this wrong?

If you have firm faith that God is all forms, why should you be afraid to keep any picture? You may worship Rama, Eswara, Jesus, Allah, Zoroaster, or Sai with the feeling that all are one. Let me give an example. Many varieties of sweets are made in India (Bharat), like Godhuma halwa, badam kheer, gulab jamun, jilebi, laddu, and Mysore pak. Though the names and forms of these sweets are different.



the sugar is the same in all of them. You may worship Rama, Sai, Vishnu, Allah, or Jesus. Keep in mind that the same divinity is in all of them. Cultivate that feeling of oneness. When you cultivate such a feeling that all are one, these outward differences will not bother you at all. If you don't like the pictures of other gods, then keep the ones you like. If you do not like the pictures of Sai Baba or Rama, you may remove them. Pictures are not important. Praying with love is!

Occasionally, I tell this story to our children (students). A student was appearing for exams. He was not good in mathematics. The math examination was scheduled for the next day. He worshipped Swami. He failed the mathematics exam that day. As he failed in mathematics, he took out Swami's picture and threw it in the cupboard. On the next day, he had the second mathematics exam. That day, he placed Lord Rama's picture on the altar and worshipped. He did not do well in the exam, even on the second day. On the third day, he had to appear for another subject, accounting. How can a person who doesn't know mathematics fare well in accounting? Again, he did not do well in the exam. So, He removed Rama's picture and put it away in the cupboard.

Wondering which God he should worship, he concluded that the feminine aspect of God as a divine mother (Goddess) is more compassionate than the masculine form of God. He replaced the picture of Lord Rama with that of the divine mother, worshipped her, and went to the exam. This time, he did not understand even the questions in the exam paper. Frustrated, he returned home and removed the picture of the divine mother. The next day, he placed Lord Vinayaka's picture and began his worship by lighting an incense stick. He noticed the fragrant smoke from the incense stick was going into the cupboard, where he had placed the pictures of all the gods and goddesses he removed. Observing that the incense he offered to Lord Vinayaka was being accepted by the other deities in the cupboard, he was so incensed that he took all the pictures of Swami, Rama, and the divine mother and bundled them up in a cloth so they could not smell the incense.

Then Sai Baba appeared to him and said, "You covered the pictures to prevent the incense fragrance from reaching the Gods. It is not the pictures that will help you. There is no benefit if you consider them only as a picture. You may worship a picture as



God, but not God as a picture. "Until now, you were considering God as a picture. But today, you believed the picture was the real form, God Himself, when you tied them in the cloth. Hence, I appeared immediately before you. You are doing all the worship to the pictures. Do not consider God as a picture. Consider the picture as God Himself, the real form. Only then will all your wishes be fulfilled." Many people today consider God's picture simply as a picture. Study well, immerse yourself in your studies, and you will surely pass the exams."


Likewise, it does not matter what form you worship or what name you chant. All names and all forms are one and the same. All are forms of the divine. If you do not find anyone to worship, then worship your parents. They are also divine forms.

Mathru Devo Bhava (Mother is God) Pithru Devo Bhava (Father is God) Acharya Devo Bhava (Guru/Teacher is God) Atithi Devo Bhava (Guest is God)

In such a situation, why should you doubt different forms of God? Do not give room for any doubts about God. God is God. So, do not criticize the names and forms of God. So put any picture, chant any name. God is one. Keep this truth in your heart. Do not change the pictures, seeing differences. Do whatever worship pleases you. That is the true path.

Seventh Question: Swami! Among the worldly spiritual practices (sadhana) we follow, which sadhana pleases you?

Whatever sadhana we undertake, we want to please Swami. Which sadhana pleases Swami? The delegate says he



would do the kind of sadhana that pleases Swami. There is only one answer to this. I don't need anything. Have faith that all human beings are divine manifestations. Have faith that divinity exists in all. That is what I love and like very much. What gives you happiness do to others. What you like, also do to others. But it is not good to harm others for the sake of your happiness.

I have been saying it over and over many times, 'Help ever, Hurt never.' That is dear to Me. Keep on helping others. Do not hurt anyone or cause harm. Also, do not foster any ill feelings toward others. Even if they insult or hate you, you keep loving them. That is Swami's main objective. There are so many people in the world but not everyone worships Me. They worship Me sometimes and criticize me at other times. It does not make any difference to Me. I will continue to love everyone. Their love is theirs, just as their sickness is theirs and their disease is their own. One's karma is

one's own; they reap the results based on their actions, but it doesn't affect Me. If not today, then someday, each one must bear the consequences of their actions.

Who can foretell how and what the future unfolds
One will certainly have to experience it
Lord Rama Himself cried like an ordinary man at the loss of Sita, His consort
The noble Pandava clan of the yore dwelt in the forest
Sustaining on wild root tubers and leaves gathered in the wild
Who can tell what is in the destiny and what the future holds?

(Telugu poem)

If you do good, you will surely reap only good. If you do bad deeds, in return, you will get bad results. Remember this and think whether a deed is good or bad. I do not hate anyone. I do not doubt anyone. I believe even those who don't have faith in Me. That is My nature. I believe in those even if they don't believe in Me. They think, "I don't believe in Swami. Why does Swami believe in me?" They think that Swami does not know that they do not have faith in Swami. But, My faith (belief) in others is always the same.

All are one and the same to me. I desire that everyone should be happy. That is what I desire. But it depends on your capacity. As I said before, after all, water is colorless. It assumes the color of the bottle in which it is poured. So, good or bad are all within you; I do not have either: they shall never enter Me. I always wish, "Loka Samastha Sukhino Bhavantu." May all the worlds be happy. Everyone should be well. Even if you hate Me, I will love you. That is My nature. This is divine quality. You criticize Me today and worship Me tomorrow, or you worship



You should become an ideal person, assisting the development and progress of Sathya Sai institutions and improving the nation.



Me today and criticize Me tomorrow. All this is due to the fickle mind, the wavering mind of an inebriated being. That is its characteristic.

One talks in a particular way when one is drunk and talks in a different way when one is sober. So, it is caused by worldly desires. Since you are completely immersed in worldly desires, your mind vacillates from one state to another. But he who has pure love remains the same, unaffected, under all circumstances. Even if he forgets Me, I will not forget him. I will always be with him, by him, in him, around and above him. Such people are very fortunate and have very sacred hearts. They are born thus due to the good merits acquired over many births, not just from this birth alone. This good fortune is the fruition of the good merits of many births.

You don't have to think about what is dear to Swami and what He dislikes. I like anything that you do from the heart. I want only the purity of your heart. You may undertake any service activity with pure

love if you have complete faith in Swami and obey Swami's command. I never say anything bad to anyone. Whatever I say is for your own good. Whatever I say, whatever I do, is good for you, not for Me. I do not have any work of My own. Everything is your work. I do only your work from dawn to dusk. So don't think that I do not have love for you. But a few fortunate ones get the chance to serve and be in the holy presence of the divine. They have good fortune. But do not be jealous that others have good fortune while you do not. The most incurable disease of all is jealousy. Cancer has medicine, but jealousy has no medicine. Cancer can be canceled, but jealousy has no cure. Jealousy will frustrate and depress anyone, bringing them down so much that they perish.

Engage Every Part of Your Body in Sacred Activities

Embodiments of Love! The members of the Sai Organization should broaden their hearts without giving room to envy and ego by considering everyone as brothers and sisters and performing service joyfully.

You want to bring many changes to the education system today. Education is essential. It can neither be stolen by thieves nor burnt by fire nor diminished by sharing with others. Education and knowledge always foster growth. Share this supreme education with the world and try to implement it. Teach good virtues to all children. "Son! Do not study for money only. You may have money today, but it may be gone tomorrow. Money comes and goes. Today's friend can turn into your enemy tomorrow. One may be strong today but become weak tomorrow. But you never lose character. Cultivate lasting virtues and foster sacred qualities. With your good character, enter society and help everyone. Why are these hands given to you? Do you know why the hand was given? Not just to eat. It is given to perform charity and help others. Charity is the ornament for the hand. Do you know why the voice is given? Not to sing movie songs! Not to hurl abuses or blame at others but to chant the name of God. Chanting the divine name is verily like wearing a beautiful necklace. So, wear the necklace of chanting the divine name, and sanctify your voice with the

holy name. Do you know why intelligence is given? Is it to become arrogant? No, no. It is given only to think about how we should contemplate the divine, attain the divine, and experience the divine. Therefore, every limb of the human body should be engaged in sacred activities.

Happiness is Union with God

Embodiments of Love! Delegates from 180 countries, especially office bearers and those in prominent positions in the organizations, have assembled here. You can lead and guide thousands of people when you follow the right path. One person can do good to many. You must be very careful in this regard. If one office bearer becomes bad, many can become bad and go astray. Be good because you are in a responsible position. You should lead a good life, do good deeds, think good, and follow the right path. Then, everyone will be inspired to follow you on the ideal path. It is of no use if you start teaching people without practicing the teachings. Even if you don't follow all of them, at least practice one or two ideals; that is enough. I don't expect you to follow everything. You should become an ideal person, assisting

the development and progress of Sathya Sai institutions and improving the nation. I do not desire to enhance My reputation. I do not require a greater name or fame. I don't long for them, but if I do, the world will comply.

Swami's hand always gives and gives; it never takes except for one thing. I will accept one thing and only one thing. That is love, love, and love; your love. I do not want anything else. I don't expect anything. I will give you whatever you ask, and however

much you ask. But I will ask for only one thing. That is love. Give love and take everything.

You should work well together within the education system. Organization members from each country should discuss this among themselves. They need not wait for orders to come from some other place. If you all work together, the system will flourish. What more do I need when you live like brothers and sisters in your countries, without differences, without jealousy, and without fighting each other? What can be more joyful than when you unite with Swami in your thoughts and spirit and work through the will of Swami? Happiness is union with God. Work with this divine thought; that is true happiness.

True happiness is not just being happy with material things of the world. So, no matter what differences of opinion you have or hatred you might have, you should work together in harmony. Do not encourage groupism, such as one group versus another. You may think that you are just hurting someone. No, no. You are hurting Me. So, I am happy when everyone lives in unity. Everyone should cultivate love without any hatred. You should swallow your hatred. Do not exhibit hatred and hate others. After you leave this place, with unity, you should approach everyone and greet even those who may hate you, calling them brothers with love. This is the true penance. This is true meditation. This is real Japa. This is true Sadhana.

One should give and take love for love's sake. Give love and receive love. If you develop love this way, the whole country will be happy. We can experience joy that has not been experienced hitherto in any other yuga (era). All of you should be united like brothers and sisters and spread love worldwide. Though you greet each other by saying, 'brother, brother,' 'hello, hello,' Sai Ram, Sai Ram,' it is clear that there are differences when you say it. 'Hello,' 'Sairam' should not be said mechanically. Say it with happiness, and speak happily and wholeheartedly with a smile. Even your laughter should not be like the artificial laughter in a movie. Laugh wholeheartedly. "Brother, past is past. Forget the past. Do not worry about the future. The present is very important. This is omnipresent." Greet each other in this manner. Develop this unity. There is immense strength in unity. There is no strength in being apart. You will only ruin yourself. Where there is love, there is unity.


For three days, you had deliberations, discussing many issues. Get rid of all these differences today. Be clean like a well-washed pearl, and be happy. Go back happily. This was a big workshop, where you arrived in a car called your body. The nuts, bolts, and springs in this car were all damaged. You came here and got everything fixed. You should also get the car repainted in this workshop. When you return to your country, others should praise you by looking at the manner in which you talk and how much you have changed since visiting Puttaparthi. They should be amazed to see that you lead an ideal life. You should thus give happiness to the world. You should achieve that ideal. I might be confusing you by saying a lot. But I say it with love to make you a better person. You should become a better person and make others better.

God's Delays Are Not Denials



IT ALL HAPPENED WHEN I WAS STUDYING FOR MY DEGREE AT TUNKU ABDUL RAHMAN COLLEGE.

Kuala Lumpur. Unlike others, I used to sit in the back row of my class, away from the commanding gaze of lecturers and was too shy to come forward to participate in activities. One day, I reluctantly joined my friends, who persuaded me to attend a talk on Hinduism at my college by a senior leader from the Sathya Sai Organization. I was comfortably sitting

at the back of the auditorium, where I was silently plotting my escape as soon as the talk commenced. However, the charisma of the speaker, the humorous anecdotes, and the simple manner of conveying a deep complex subject mesmerized me. He had an aura of positivity, which was inspiring. This deepened my curiosity to find out more about where he came from. One thing led to another, and on a Vinayaka Chaturthi day, I found myself at the Bangsar Sai Center for the first time, singing *bhajans* along with other devotees. That was how Bhagawan, in His unique, mysterious way, pulled me into His fold.

I was also attracted to His devotees in this Sai Center. They also reflected the same aura of positivity, which encouraged me to frequent the center more often. I was very impressed with the energy, dynamism, and overall commitment of the members of this Center. However, at that time, I was not really attracted to Swami. I was only curious about Him because of the devotion and reverence He commanded from these beautiful people.

Travel to See Sathya Sai Baba

It was this curiosity that led me to answer, "Bangalore," when my father, who worked in an airline, asked me whether I wished to travel on a free ticket to any place I wanted, a privilege reserved for airline employees. From Bangalore, I took my first 6-hour bus journey and landed in Prasanthi Nilayam in 1986.

Before leaving Malaysia, the Bangsar Sai Center President gave me some books he had written, to get them blessed by Swami. By His grace, I was seated in the very first row during my first-ever *darshan*. All this was very new to me and I had no clue about what happens during these sessions. As Swami arrived, walking gently on the sand, I saw

people offering letters to Him, touching His feet, and craning their necks to see Him for an extra moment! I was lost in thinking how I should address Him.

"Devotees have told me to address Him as Swami. But His name is Sai Baba. Should I call Him 'Sai' or 'Baba' or the complete 'Sai Baba'? Maybe it is best that I address Him by His full name, Sathya Sai Baba..."

Though I had decided to call Him by His name and mentally even rehearsed it a few times, when He finally came near me, I got on my knees and spontaneously said, "Swami, here are books from Malaysia. The author wanted me to get them blessed by You..."

"I know... I know..." He said and placed His hand on the books I was holding. Automatically, I bowed down and touched His feet to receive my first padanamaskar. Swami then moved on.

What is an Interview?

After that, somehow, I found myself seated in the first row for the next 3-4 darshan sessions, even when we went by the general token lines. So, every day, I would be blessed to receive padanamaskar. Seeing my good fortune, three Malaysian ladies who had come earlier to Prasanthi Nilayam came over to me and said, "Swami seems to bless you daily. Why don't you ask Him for an interview?"

"What is an interview?" I asked

"Swami will take us into a separate room and materialize rings and chains for us!"

"Oh! He gives them to everybody?"

"Not everybody, but the chance of getting them from Him is high during an interview."

"So, what should I ask?"

"Ask Swami for an interview, and He will probably ask how many are there in the group. Say four... it's four of us." I reluctantly agreed, dismissing the possibility that this would ever take place.

Then, I went to give the books to the administrators of the University. They asked me if I was here for the first time. I said yes.

They then asked a volunteer (sevadal) to escort me and give me a guided tour of the University Administrative Block, the stadium, Swami's pet elephant Sai Gita, the planetarium, etc. I assumed that this was a courtesy extended to all visitors. Only much later did I realize that this was also due to His divine grace.

Then, slowly, the Master scriptwriter unfolded His play.

A gentleman of Chinese origin, we will call him Chan, wearing a red T-shirt with the words "Drink Anchor Beer" approached me. I began chatting with him and learned that he was also a first-timer at the place. He had come as a tourist and simply wanted to know "what on earth was happening here?"

Then, I narrated what the Malaysian ladies told me and urged him to ask for an interview.

He replied, "What is an interview?"

I took the opportunity to educate him and told him that in such situations, Swami would give him chains and rings. I added, "When He asks how many people are there, say it's five of us. I shall do the same if I get the chance..."

The deal was made. It was all so casual, never realizing what was to happen. I never, for one moment, thought that the divine, in His own way, was orchestrating a deep, incisive surgery on my ego for my spiritual advancement.

An Interview is an Inner View

It was a Sunday, and it appeared that the whole world had come for darshan. There was not an inch of space available because, taking advantage of the Sunday, an overwhelming crowd had come to feast their eyes on their beloved Lord. I guess my luck ran out that day for this particular darshan as I got a seat at the back of Sai Kulwant hall, with my back leaning against the compound wall and a sea of humanity separating me from Swami.

Suddenly, my eyes fell on Chan seated precisely in the first row.

The stage was set. Swami appeared. There was a hushed silence. Every neck was craning to get a glimpse of Him as He walked past. From where I was seated, Swami appeared small and distant.

Then Swami suddenly stopped where Chan was seated. I heard Swami ask, "How many?"

I heard him reply, "Five."

Swami said, "Come."

Then, Chan stood up and started waving to me! I waved back and stood up, making my way toward the front. As I was walking, saying, "Sairam! Swami is calling Malaysia," the sea of humanity in front of me parted as the Red Sea parted for Moses!

I am quite tall, and Swami also saw me walking. Swami was now signing someone's book, but I knew He saw me getting up. I reached the elevated dais area, and with a few more steps. I would be in the world's most desired 'heaven,' the interview room. Chan had already happily sailed into the interview room.

For some reason, which I still do not know, something made me turn back to see Swami. What made me turn? Who made me turn, and why? Till today my mind cannot fathom this.

Swami was standing only a few meters away. Simultaneously, as I turned back to see Swami, He lifted his gaze from the book



to stare at me. No other director could have planned this drama with such incredible timing and synchronous movement other than the divine director Himself.

Our eyes met. The pin-drop silence in the hall was shattered by Swami's question,

"Hey, you! Where are you going?"

"Swami, interview..."

"Not you! Sit down."

I took one step forward and said, "...five... group of five...Malaysia," referring to His conversation with Chan. I was now deeply troubled and feeling very embarrassed.

Swami said sharply, "...Not all Malaysians get an interview. Sit down!"

I thought that Swami was not aware of my conversation and the deal with Chan. So I tried explaining, "Swami, that man said five... I am one of..."

"SIT DOWN!" interrupted Swami.

The whole hall witnessed this dress-down. The Malaysian ladies who got up to go for the interview, after witnessing the calamity befalling me, quietly sat down in their respective places.

I took two more steps toward Swami, thinking of explaining myself.

"SIT DOWN," Swami said and His eyes seemed ablaze now. A few volunteers quickly rushed to escort me to my place. I sat down in the space vacated by Chan in the first row.

The humiliation I felt at that moment was so painful that I wished the earth would swallow me up! As I sat and tried to analyze what had happened, a thousand thoughts flooded my mind. Why me? I did not deserve this. I never wanted an interview. Swami had seen me getting up. But why pull me to the front and 'smash' me in front of thousands? Why Swami? Why? That, too, was my first visit. Uncontrollable tears kept gushing from my eyes. The pain got aggravated when devotees sitting near me tried comforting me. It was like oil being poured over fire.

But that was it. Chan from our 'Group of Five' went in alone.

Many long minutes passed, and then, the bhajans began. That was when Chan walked out of the interview room. His face seemed red, and profuse tears were running down his cheeks. Something had obviously happened inside! A few minutes later, Swami came out and walked straight to me.

"When are you leaving?"

"Swami, this Wednesday...Three more days..." "Ah! You have got time. Why do you worry?"

He was trying to comfort me, but I was beyond consolation. In fact, it took me a couple of years to share this whole episode with my family back in Malaysia.

The next day, when I met Chan, he was a completely transformed being, as evidenced by what he was wearing and how he spoke with love and humility. I marveled at his transformation. I, too, had a transformation. I felt that spirituality is not for the casual and the complacent. The surgical incision



Swami did was painful, but the experience empowered me to have a deeper and more serious perspective on spirituality. I felt my inhibitions were stripped. I decided I would simply plunge into the activities of the Sai Center.

That gift of an interview indeed had provided Chan with an inner view, while the denial of the same interview gave me an inner view also.

Interview at Last


After that 'interview-denial,' I plunged into different activities at my Sai Center. Strangely, the more active I became at the Sai Center, the more my love for Swami grew. Sai activities became an obsession. Though I was a research student completing my master's and PhD at different Universities, 80% of my time was spent at the Sai Center.

My father was worried. So were many of my relatives. Their advice to me was the same, "Stop spending so much time in this Sai Center. Focus on your education and career..."

I did not mind their well-intentioned advice. But I was helpless. The love I felt toward Swami and His work was simply unstoppable.

Swami had told me during that first trip that I 'had time' (to get an interview). That time turned out to be 12 years! Yes, I got my first interview, along with my wife, after 12 long years! During this time period, one of the activities I was deeply involved in was scripting dramas to be presented to Swami in Prasanthi Nilayam. I was blessed to be involved in 12 drama productions, all of which Swami watched and enjoyed.

Swami took me and my wife into the inner interview room. When I saw Him there, so close and available to me, I broke down. I began shedding profuse tears. emanated in surging waves from my heart, and as I laid my head on His lap, I cried happy tears like I had never done in my life before.

Swami smiled. He patted me on my head. I felt salvation. I felt blessed. But every interview is an inner view. Swami is a perfectionist and is constantly striving for our evolution.


He said, "Emotion is one thing. Devotion is another. Emotion is important, but devotion is most important."

THE FIRST TIME I HEARD OF BHAGAWAN SRI SATHYA SAI BABA WAS IN THE LATE

1970S while in college. Unfortunately, I did not take Him seriously and even made fun of Him, influenced by what I read in the newspapers about fake Babas who had cheated their followers. I thought Sathya Sai, too, was one of them. Additionally, His claim of being God in the Kali Yuga was impossible for me to comprehend.

Why Fear When I Am Here

In the 1950s and 1960s, I grew up in Hong Kong, Malaysia, and Brunei as my father was a soldier in the 6th QEO Gurkha Rifles of the British Army. My mother was a school-teacher in the same battalion. Sometimes, when I played with my friends, there would be situations where we would need help solving problems or issues. I would remark, "Why fear when I am here?" to make the mood lighter. I felt proud for coming up with a catchy phrase without realizing that I was actually using Swami's assurance to His devotees!

From childhood, I have been keen on serving the community and wanted to become a doctor. But, considering the age limit, other technical challenges, and course prerequisites, I could not get into a medical college. My mother advised me to take up teaching as a profession and apply for British Army schools as she had. Though that was the last thing I wanted to do, I eventually took up teaching as a career and developed a passion for the profession. In 1987, I was selected for a teaching post in a British Army school in Hong Kong.

My experience with accepting Swami was similar to my choosing a career in teaching, although much later in life. Considering Him God was the last thing I wanted to do, though my parents had accepted Him as such.

Swami's Master Plan Unfolds In December 1989, I got married to Sarita. She

had faith in Swami as she witnessed Swami's

miracles first-hand at her own home in India as a child. So, before she flew to Hong Kong to start our life together, my father gifted her a large picture of Swami. But I did not allow my wife to place that picture in our shrine! In 1992, after a brief stint at the British Army School in Brunei, I was promoted and posted in Hong Kong, where my college friend, Urmila, became my colleague. She was a follower of Baba and encouraged me to read books on Swami. She even lent me some books from her collection. As I read these books, my antipathy toward Him turned to curiosity, and I gradually gained faith. We also started experiencing His miracles at home. Over time, with a small group of friends, we started holding Sai bhajans weekly. Urmila was instrumental in not only

us bhajans and sacred chants.

introducing us to Swami but also teaching

One of the many miracles we experienced was in 1995 when our eldest son, Amodh, suffered from a very high fever of 103-104°F for several days. He was just over three years old, and the medicines were not working at all. One night, my wife woke me up at 2 AM, very worried about Amodh's condition. I promised to take him to the doctor the next morning, but she continued her prayers, holding on to Swami.

The next morning, we were in for a pleasant surprise. Amodh had no fever; he had fully recovered and was playing by himself. Pointing to Swami's photo, the three-year-old child told us that Sathya Sai Baba had come out from there at night and gave him a spoonful of water to drink. "Sai Baba went to each and every room in the house. Then, He returned to the bedroom and went back into the same photo on the wall..."

How could a child make up such a story and narrate what happened in such detail? We realized that it was our compassionate Bhagawan who came, gave darshan, and cured our son of a high fever.

Swami's Blessings can do Wonders


I always wanted a daughter, but when my wife gave birth to two sons in 1991 and 1992, I lost all hope. Then, in 1994, when we were living in Hong Kong, my wife became pregnant for the third time. One day, Urmila, my college friend and colleague, visited us at home with a handkerchief, which Swami had blessed. She knew we wanted a daughter. So, she asked my wife to rub the handkerchief on her belly and told her that Swami's blessings could do wonders. But we had our doubts and were not confident it would help.

Dispelling all doubts, lo and behold, our daughter, Surina, was born in September of that year to our greatest joy but much to the surprise of the doctor and the medical staff. The nurses then shared the reason for their surprise with my wife, that the doctor had told them in confidence much earlier in her pregnancy that it was going to be a boy this time, too. We not only thanked Swami but also realized that Swami knows our innermost thoughts and desires and that His blessings can do wonders.

When Swami calls us, He makes the Impossible Possible

In 2002, my mother was ill with heart problems, and my wife, Sarita, traveled with my youngest son, Ajitesh, from Brunei to Nepal to take my mother to the Super Specialty Hospital in Puttaparthi. Sarita and Ajitesh traveled with my parents to Puttaparthi for the first time. The doctors in Super Specialty did all the necessary tests the same day and were surprised to see that my mother was able to endure such a long journey with only 15% of her heart working. My family was blessed to have Swami's darshan before returning to Nepal. We realized when Swami calls you, the impossible becomes possible.

The same year, I had a strong desire to visit Puttaparthi, but a few days before I went to Nepal, I discovered that direct flights to Bangalore by the then Royal Nepal Airlines



were discontinued. Although disappointed, I was determined to reach Puttaparthi via any flight. But to my great and pleasant surprise, on reaching Kathmandu, I found that Royal Nepal Airlines had just resumed direct flights to Bangalore. This was convenient for me because I was traveling alone and for the first time to Puttaparthi. I spent a few days in Puttaparthi and had Swami's darshan before flying back to Kathmandu. After reaching Kathmandu, I was further surprised to find out that Royal Nepal Airlines had decided to stop direct flights to Bangalore once again. This was when I realized when Swami calls you, He makes all the arrangements.

Swami Feeds Birds in Brunei

We were in Brunei in 2009. My 17-year-old second son, Ishan, was visiting us from his boarding school for the weekend. As he was getting ready for breakfast, from the corner of his eyes, he saw someone standing on the porch outside our living room. As he turned around to see who it was, he saw Swami in His orange robe, standing and feeding the birds with rice grains, which we did every morning at the same spot. Just as Ishan called out Swami's name, He disappeared. When we all came running into the living room, Ishan described in detail what he saw. Who says that one has to travel to some place to 'see' Swami? Swami can give darshan to His devotees in any country, even far away, at any time.

Swami's Protection is Forever

In 2017, I retired from the British Army school in Brunei and, by Swami's grace, opened a restaurant in Kuala Belait, Brunei. On December 1, 2020, we drove from Kuala Belait to the capital city of Bandar Seri Begawan, about 110 kilometers away. I always play Sai bhajans in the car and usually drive very fast because, otherwise, I would feel sleepy.

So, I was driving around 160-170 km per hour on the highway. Halfway along the journey, I heard a slight popping sound behind me on the right-hand side of the car, but I continued driving. Suddenly, it struck me that, perhaps, one of the tires had punctured. So, I stopped my car on the side of the highway to check the tires, and to my horror, I saw that the rear tire was not only punctured but completely shredded. I wondered how my car did not go out of control, overturn, or even wobble at such high speed! It was the Sai bhajans that had miraculously drawn Sai's grace!

As he turned around to see who it was, he saw Swami in His orange robe, standing and feeding the birds with rice grains.

My next problem was getting the spare tire out because it was kept under the floor in the rear of the Toyota Innova I was driving. My poor eyesight made it difficult to insert the retrieving rod into a groove in a small hole. As I was struggling, suddenly, a van stopped behind us. The Indonesian driver and his friend got out and offered to help, saying that he saw us stranded and took a U-turn to come and help us! As he changed the tire, my wife noticed his van's number plate (KH 7830), which surprisingly had the same digits as our vehicle (KJ 3087) but in a different sequence! After he had changed the tire, we offered them some money, which they refused. My wife then offered some grapes, which they happily accepted. They told us they visit Kuala Belait twice weekly to deliver orders. We invited them to have free lunch at our restaurant during their next visit and noted their phone number. Though we sent them several messages via WhatsApp, inviting them to lunch at our restaurant, they never responded. And, to this day, Sarita and I wonder if it was Shirdi Sai Baba and Swami who came to our rescue that day in the form of the two Indonesian gentlemen.

Gold Chain Lost in Brunei Found in Nepal

In August 2019, Sarita had to travel from Brunei to Dharamshala, India, via New Delhi because her mother was seriously ill. On the day of her flight, Sarita decided to remove her gold necklace which was presented to her by my mother after our wedding. She kept it in a container on the dresser. After several weeks, she returned to Brunei and wanted to wear the necklace, but it was nowhere to be found! She and my daughter, Surina, both searched for it everywhere but in vain. Sarita finally decided to seek Swami's help through prayer and picking a 'Yes-No'

chits, as many Sai devotees do when in a difficult or unfortunate situation. Swami's answer to her was that the necklace would be found which set her mind to rest.

Two years later, in December 2021, Sarita went to Kathmandu to get some important documents we needed in Brunei. One day, she decided to sort out some of our suitcases and found a box in one of the suitcases. When she opened the box, she discovered a small yellow jewelry purse. In Brunei, all jewelry shops pack the jewelry when we purchase it in small purses with the shop's name clearly printed on it. But this purse had no typical branding with the shop's name. She curiously opened it to see what was inside. To her utter amazement, it was the gold necklace that was missing in Brunei!

How could a gold necklace lost in Brunei be found in Kathmandu? I believe it was exactly like how my faith, which was lost in my head, was found in my heart, through Swami's unconditional love and grace.



In a discourse delivered during the Summer Course in 1977, Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba says, "If an ant locates sugar in some place, that ant is not going immediately to eat the sugar and fill its stomach in a selfish manner. The meeting was extended beyond the scheduled time to allow further dialogue between speakers and the audience. SRI LANKAProviding Medical Care at the Esala Festival

The Esala Perahera festival is celebrated annually in Sri Lanka. This year, it was celebrated from August 11 to 21. This 10-day celebration honors the Sacred Tooth Relic (of Lord Buddha) and the four 'guardian' deities: Lord Natha, Lord Vishnu, Lord Kataragama, and Goddess Pattini.

During the festival, the Sri Sathya Sai International Organization (SSSIO) of Sri Lanka held a free medical camp, supported by a team of eight doctors, six paramedics, and 15 volunteers. Over the three days of the camp, more than 720 people were treated for a wide range of illnesses. The team provided effective and compassionate care for respiratory infections, gastrointestinal illnesses, urinary tract infections, allergies, eye and skin infections, asthma, diabetes mellitus, thyroid disorders, and cardiovascular diseases. The camp also addressed the treatment of joint and muscle pains and emergency cases like diabetic ketoacidosis and chest pain in patients with a suspected cardiac history. The SSSIO Sri Lanka





remains committed to this sacred service, embodying the values of love, compassion, and selflessness.

The SSSIO International Sai Young Adults (YA) Leaders Retreat of 2024, themed "Make your Role Roar," took place from July 26 to 29, 2024, in the vibrant city of Athens, Greece. Approximately 55 YA leaders participated, representing 25 countries, including Argentina, Australia, Azerbaijan, Cambodia, Canada, Colombia, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, Germany, Hong Kong SAR, Ireland, Malaysia, Mexico, the Netherlands, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Poland, Serbia, Singapore, South Africa, Trinidad and Tobago, the United Kingdom, Uruguay, and the USA. All attendees shared a common desire to come closer to Swami and connect with other YAs who share the same love for Him.

On the first day, the retreat started with a beautiful Omkar and energetic bhajans, followed by a warm welcome by Ms. Vahinie Pillay (International YA Coordinator) and Ms. Shruthi Vijayakumar (Deputy International YA Coordinator), who recounted the wonderful episode in which Swami blessed the entire retreat program with the manifestation of His sacred Vibhuti at the altar of Ms. Vahinie Pillay.

The program started with a creative activity called "The Hat Exercise," where the YA's creative skills were put to the test with a twist. Participants were instructed to create their hats by exploring the responsibilities that they most identify themselves with, in a creative way. They were tasked with creating hats using materials such as cardboard, markers, and colors and writing on them the qualities or roles that define them in their daily lives. 




Ocean of Music



Bahía de Caraquez Ecuador

Nobody would have imagined that 1998, with its disastrous earthquakes and El Niño-generated storms, would be a good year for the coastal city of Bahía de Caraquez in the Ecuadorian province of Manabí in South America. When these disasters struck, volunteers from the Sri Sathya Sai International Organization (SSSIO) plunged into service and relief work in the affected areas. During the course of service, they were inspired to do something for the affected children as part of their long-term efforts for rehabilitation and a return to normalcy. That selfless thought was the seed for a Sathya Sai School in Ecuador.

Power Of Selfless Thought

The pure thoughts of the South American devotees began to take shape in a most miraculous manner. A suitable plot of land was identified for the school, but the landowner wanted a price 60 times higher than what the devotees had planned to invest! Unable to pay that ludicrously high amount, they decided to let go-and let God take over!



In February 1999, several devotees from Ecuador traveled to India to have Swami's darshan and seek blessings for procuring the land. Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba says that a pure thought from a pure heart is more effective than a mantra. When the devotees returned, they were in for a pleasant 'surprise.' The landowner came to offer the land, totally free of cost, as a donation for noble work! He had just recovered from a severe health crisis after undergoing multiple open-heart surgeries. This experience actually 'opened' his heart to consider this donation more as an opportunity to serve rather than a monetary gift. The devotees were overjoyed with this miraculous transformation of the heart and Swami's blessings.

The Divine Assurance

In September 2000, the devotees were back to see Swami again. On September 26, as Swami gracefully glided into the hall granting darshan, Mr. Alfredo Harmsen got up on his knees. Swami walked straight to him. Stuttering, he asked, "Swami, would You... You bless...bless the Sai School Project in Bahía?"

"Eh?"

"Swami, would You bless the Sai School Project in Bahía?" he repeated, taking a bit more courage this time.

"Where?"

"In Bahía, Ecuador, Swami."

Swami then said in a very firm and clear voice, "Do it. I bless."

Swami then waved His right hand and materialized *vibhuti* for the devotees. The project had been blessed, nay, commanded by the Avatar of the Age.

The Divine Word Bears Fruit

Architect Fernando Hinojosa, who started planning the school's construction in December 2000, stated that it was the first time that he had carried out a project inspired by divine love. The drawings and plans were drawn up based on the five human values of Truth, Right Conduct, Peace, Love, and Nonviolence.

As of 2024, the school has completed 24 years of educating children from 4 to 17 years old. There are 430 students, with about 30 children in each class, and more than two dozen teachers with master's degrees. Needless to say, the school ranks high in academic achievement. But what impresses the parents and community the most is the students' adherence to human values and participation in regular community service activities. The school provides education completely free of charge.





The Sathya Sai School is part of the Sri Sathya Sai Baba Trust of Ecuador. It is supported mostly by modest contributions from parents, scholarships by sponsors, monthly contributions from companies, and other donors. The supporters feel inspired by the school's environment and provide heartfelt support.

Listed below is an abbreviated timeline of the school's achievements over the past 24 years:

1998

Sathya Sai devotees rendered service in Bahía de Caraquez, which was affected by El Nino and an earthquake ('severe' category) and were inspired to provide longterm assistance to the local children.

1999

The landowner miraculously donates the land (which he originally intended to sell for 60 times the price) to build a school.

2000

Swami blessed the school project on September 26 with His loving prophetic words, "Do it, I Bless."

2001

The Sathya Sai School at Bahía de Caraquez began with students starting at the kindergarten level, with plans to add a new higher grade each year.

The Sathya Sai School at Bahía de Caraquez became a high school with the addition of Grade 8 to the program.

2014

The school became fiscal-missionary (a private school that receives government support for resources, including teachers) after an agreement with the Ministry of Education of the Government of Ecuador.

2019

The Directors of the Sathya Sai School were invited to join the National Values Education Board, a legal, civil society institution created to promote education in human values in Ecuador.

The 1st International Meeting on Education in Human Values was held in Guayaquil thanks to the collaboration between the National Board of Education with Values. the Sathya Sai School of Bahía de Caraquez, the Institute of Sathya Sai Education in Human Values (ISSEHV) of Ecuador, and the Ministry of Education of Ecuador.

2020

During the year, 14 Open Classes of the Sathya Sai Education in Human Values Program and 10 Meditation Master Classes were held, resulting in more than 70,000 views.

The 2nd International Meeting on Education in Human Values was held online in collaboration with the Institute of Sathya Sai Education in Human Values (ISSEHV) of Colombia and the Ecuadorian Pedagogy Network.





2021

The ISSEVH of Mexico also joined the collaborative team to conduct the "3rd International Meeting on Education in Human Values–Integral Education for Childhood," which garnered 130,000 views. Later in the year, the 4th international meeting was also held.

2022

The Sathya Sai School of Bahía de Caraquez won first place among 50 schools at the 1st International Meeting of Educational Innovation.' The Ministry of Education organized the meeting in coordination with the Private Technical University of Loja to learn about trends, practices, and innovative educational initiatives from Ecuador and other countries.

2023

The 7th International Meeting on Integral Education in Human Values with the theme "Mainstreaming Values for Conscious Citizenship" was held. The Ministry of Education of Ecuador offered to co-organize this event and invited the Ministries of Education of Colombia and Mexico to participate.

2024

A meditation room (80% complete) is under construction and will be used for meditation, yoga, workshops, and teacher meetings.

The 8th International Meeting on Integral Education in Human Values, with the theme "Linking Hearts at School to Live in Peace," was held from September 16 to 18, 2024. Ecuador's Minister of Education was a speaker at this event.


